Submission on whether the entry of **Shed 26**, **Semaphore Road**, **New Port** should be confirmed in the South Australian Heritage Register



(a) it demonstrates important aspects of the evolution or pattern of the State's history	Shed 26 stands as one of a few remaining maritime buildings on the Port Adelaide docks which exemplify the State's maritime history. The visual sawtooth roof shed is a striking maritime building on the docks and under that roof, various engineering activities involving maintenance, fabrication and modernization were carried out through the South Australian Harbor Board from the mid 1950's to late 1980's. Shed 26 represent a key element of the continuum of the Port Adelaide maritime history and we have a unique opportunity to continue this historical story through repurposing Shed 26 for current and future generations. There are many examples in Australia and overseas of maritime spaces that fall into disrepair and are then rejuvenated through adaptive reuse. The alternative, the demolition of Shed 26, will create a residential development unrelated and lost to our maritime history.

It was the era of the South Australian Harbor Board from the mid 1950's to late 1980's and the industrial modernisation phase of our maritime historical story. The men who worked in this building as young apprentices tell the stories of the engineering works carried out and the social and economic impact of Shed 26 during those years. As a local community person, I value the rich history of maritime Port Adelaide and see the repurposing of Shed 26 as a wonderful opportunity to stay richly connected with our maritime Port Adelaide history and integrate a repurposed Shed 26 into the new residential space.
