Submission on whether the entry of **Shed 26**, **Semaphore Road**, **New Port** should be confirmed in the South Australian Heritage Register

The South Australian Heritage Council can only take into account heritage significance of a place as defined by the *Heritage Places Act 1993* (Act) when considering places for entry on the South Australian Heritage Register. (a) it demonstrates important aspects of the evolution or pattern of the State's history	Shed 26 (known locally as the sawtooth building) is situated on the northern bank of the inner Harbor of the Port River. Shed 26 demonstrates the evolution of local maritime industrial activities because of its historical function and its strategic position on the north side of the Harbor directly opposite the historically significant Adelaide Milling Company and Harts Mill complex. Because both the prominent Harts Mill and Shed 26 straddle the river at this site they work together aesthetically and as a historical reminder of South Australia's maritime commerce. I argue that a pattern of our history is truly represented by these two structures. Adelaide Milling Company and Harts Mill were built in the early days of the colony to support trade and commerce and the bulk handling of milled grain onto waiting sailing ships. Shed 26 was built about hundred years later by the Department of Marine and Harbors to assist the re-purposing of the Port for the modern industrial era. Together these enterprises strongly represent the pattern of development of our local maritime history. The Adelaide Milling	



	Company and Harts Mill is thankfully recognised for their historical significance but if the State and the local community were to lose Shed 26 a continuous living heritage of about 170 years would be severed. The removal of Shed 26 would be like severing a limb as the community would no longer have a tangible reminder of the inner harbor activities on both sides of the river. The community has already suffered the loss of boat building sheds that were located along Jenkins Street on the north side of the Port River. Shed 26 is our last substantial edifice on the northern bank that represents the labour and commerce that was once so vital to the growth of the State and the identity of the Port Adelaide community.


